Year 5 children were excited to complete their first day at secondary school on Wednesday! They were welcomed to DGS and SBS as part of an experience day where Year 5 pupils from local primary schools could participate in secondary school style lessons. At the boys' school, they watched some amazing chemical reactions take place, played a new version of bench ball and enjoyed experiencing a new coding programme in IT. At the girls' school they worked on air resistance and gravity in a science lesson and designed different boxes for chocolates in maths. It was lovely to hear the children becoming excited about their future secondary school.

Year 5 had a great day of discovery at the Sutton Courtenay Environmental Education Centre yesterday (second group visiting today). Children discovered the range of life in a pond and explored their discoveries under a microscope. They spent the afternoon learning about plants and collecting their own specimens to look deeper into the makeup of plants and the process of pollination. It was a great day of learning made fun.

On Wednesday, **Year 3** thoroughly enjoyed an afternoon of activities based on this term's Kensuke's Kingdom topic. They whittled sticks to make fishing spears, painted cobbles, made fishing nets and learnt how to start a fire. In the spirit of the book, they even cooked fish on the fire. The smoky mackerel disappeared very quickly as an end-of -day treat! Thank you to our parent helper and to all the staff who helped us to be flexible with our plans and enabled the afternoon to go ahead.

Next Wednesday is also Year 3's DT Monster Making Day and parents are invited to open classrooms at 2.50pm to see what amazing monster heads the children will have made and also to see the children's books. They will also give an update on the turtles project.

It was a lovely turn out from **Year 2** adults for their final Open Classroom. They looked through all the amazing work they have done this year, played habitat bingo and shared books.

Year 1 enjoyed a sensory exploration of space within a huge space dome on Monday. They learnt some fascinating things about different constellations and their link to Greek legends in particular Orion's Belt. The children loved star gazing and were mesmerised by the different patterns in the sky! The children enjoyed the experience so much that they did not want to get out of the dome and hoped it would visit every week!

Foundation Stage and Year One were visited by **Nick Cope**, a local songwriter and performer. The children thoroughly enjoyed singing along to his funny songs, 'A Round of Applause for the Dinosaur' and 'Grow, Grow' Children were inspired in the week to make their own music and poems.
