# **NOTICES** ...

We have a **parent governor vacancy**; we will therefore be holding an election. As many of you may already know, the governing body has an extremely important role: it is responsible for strategic planning, policy, staff appointments and finance, amongst other things. Parents or anyone who has parental responsibility for a pupil on the school roll at the time of the election can stand for election, can nominate someone for election and can vote in the election. A definition of parents eligible to stand and to vote is on display outside the school office. All nominations should be sent in to the school office by **9.00am Tuesday 9<sup>th</sup> October**. You can nominate yourself. Every nomination must be signed by the candidate stating that they are willing to stand. Please indicate who your children are and what year group they are in. We also need approximately 100 words about the candidate saying why they would like to be a governor. Candidates cannot withdraw from the election once ballot papers have been issued.

On **Friday 12<sup>th</sup> October** we will send the ballot forms with the names of the candidates and the details taken from the nomination forms home with the children so please watch out for the letter! The ballot is secret; you can send or post the ballot paper back in a sealed envelope, or drop it into the ballot box outside the school office. All the votes must be in by **9.30am Thursday 18<sup>th</sup> October.** They will be counted at this time. If the number of candidates is the same as the number of places (ie. 1) then no election will take place – an appointment is made. In the event of a tie, the candidate with the youngest child in school will be elected. As you know we can't allow **dogs** to be on the premises (unless it is part of a planned event). The car park gate has an unused grass area on the left (as you look at it). If you choose to use this option please do pick up any mess which might be left behind. Reminder: Admissions to school (Academic Year 19/20): If your child was born between 1st September 2014 and 31st August 2015 you must apply for a school place for your child for entry in the academic year September 2018. ### Please remember the following:-


- It is the responsibility of parents/carers to apply for a school place by the deadline of 15 January 2019
- If your child is attending nursery classes within a primary school, you must still apply for a place in the main school
- You can list three different schools in order of preference. We strongly advise you to use all three preferences
- We advise you to enter your catchment (or designated) school as one of your preferences
- Attending your catchment school does not entitle you to free home to school transport if it is not your closest school and / under 2 miles away
- If your application is late, you are far less likely to get a place at one of your preferred schools.

# SCHOOL INSIGHTS

Below is just one of the models we use when dealing with child development. It is useful to visualise that we all need to sit in the middle of the diagram balancing out all three aspects but we can often move to or sit more prominently in one aspect, if so we need to try to get back to the middle. It sometimes helps with processing if this is explained to the child (especially in older age groups and adults). The question for any situation is: are we using too much of one aspect- ie. Thinking without acting, behaving without thinking, responding entirely emotionally, etc.
