On Monday children in **Years 5 and 6** had a Fire Safety and Awareness presentation. Did you know the biggest cause of house fires is lighters and matches? Children were taught about the dangers of playing with lighters and matches. They were shown how to 'Stop, Drop and Roll' if their clothes ever caught on fire, shown how to test a fire alarm and the importance of having at least one in every home - *firefighters test their alarms on 'Test It Tuesday'*. An activity booklet has been emailed to parents for children to do to reinforce the importance of fire safety.

Class 2 and 3 children showed off their Maths skills to parents and Grandparents yesterday. They demonstrated a few ways to use our number line, explained their reasoning when answering questions, and showed one way to use the parts whole resource. ## **COMING UP...**

After a very successful Term 1 workshop on anxiety, the second of our Mental Health and Well Being Workshops will be held on Tuesday 11<sup>th</sup> December from 5pm-6pm and will focus on 'Ages and Stage: helping children to grow and develop independence at the right age', delivered by our learning mentor, Carol Saunders. During the workshops, discussions will be held around what parents expect of children at the different stages of development and how this aligns with what we already know about development of children. Whether you have high or low expectations of your child's independence, this workshop will give you useful tips to take home so that your child is developing their independence at the right pace. We are limiting places to 25 so that an informal atmosphere is upheld in which everyone feels comfortable saying what they want to say. Places will be allocated on a first come, first served basis. Ladygrove will be thinking about **bike safety** during national Road Safety next week. There will be activities across the school including a Beep Beep day on Wednesday 21st November in KS1. There will be an KS2 assembly and whole school competition to design a bike helmet. The top 3 designs get entered into a national competition, the winner of which gets their helmet made and they win a bike and safety gear. On Thursday, Tesco will be bringing a truck (front cab only) into school for the afternoon. There will be a chance for children to visit the truck and appreciate its size, explore the cab and realise the limited visibility big lorries have of cyclists and pedestrians on the road. The truck will stay in place until 3:30pm to allow children to visit with their parents as they leave school to give a wider appreciation for the issues of road safety and awareness and allow all children the chance to see the truck if they want to.

Reminder: Admissions to school (Academic Year 19/20): If your child was born between 1st September 2014 and 31st August 2015 you must apply for a school place for your child for entry in the academic year September 2018. You will be able to apply on-line from 25<sup>th</sup> October. Please visit <a href="https://www.oxfordshire.gov.uk/admissions">www.oxfordshire.gov.uk/admissions</a> for further information. The deadline line date is 15<sup>th</sup> January 2019.

## Please remember the following:-

- It is the responsibility of parents/carers to apply for a school place by the deadline of 15 January 2019
- If your child is attending nursery classes within a primary school, you must still apply for a place in the main school
- You can list three different schools in order of preference. We strongly advise you to use all three preferences
- We advise you to enter your catchment (or designated) school as one of your preferences
- Attending your catchment school does not entitle you to free home to school transport if it is not your closest school and / under 2 miles away
- $\bullet$  If your application is late, you are far less likely to get a place at one of your preferred schools.


