Parking: In a recent newsletter we highlighted that a letter has been sent to all Didcot schools to urge their parents to park appropriately or find alternative methods to get to school. We continue to be informed by the public and parents that one or two cars are still being parked irresponsibly such as half way over the pavement. We have now informed our link PCSOs who will attend our pick up or drop off times at some point in the near future to talk to anyone who parks irresponsibly. Thank you in anticipation of your support with this.

Next term, Mrs Manthorpe will be running **open-air revision sessions for children in year six**. Children don't need to bring anything extra. The sessions will run from 8:25am to 8:40am and are optional. Should your child wish to attend, no permission slip is required, they just need to turn up promptly! Grammar and maths will be covered each time. On the first week back, the sessions will be on Wednesday 24 April and Friday 26th. For the following two weeks, revision will be held on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday mornings.

In **Term 5, Year 5** are exploring the question: How do religious families and communities practice their faith and how is this seen in local communities? If anyone is able to contribute towards this question and would be happy to talk to the Year 5 children, please contact the Year 5 team.

Trips: Since moving to ParentPay we have found an increasing number of trips are not being paid for. Trips are planned to enhance topic work and we ask parents to pay a voluntary contribution towards this. This year to date, we are approaching £2,000 of unpaid voluntary contributions. This is not sustainable and we would be grateful if you please log into your parentpay account to check that you are up to date with any contributions (past and present). Future trips are at risk of being cancelled if we do not have enough contributions to cover expenses.

Maths Matters to Ladygrove Park School. Sessions are structured carefully (by experienced Ladygrove staff) to build on the children's confidence and deepen their understanding of maths operations, stretching those students who were already confident and supporting others. This term, we will continue to tailor the sessions to the needs of the children. As always, there are two sessions: years 2, 3 and 4 at 10am and years 5 and 6 at 11:15am. Excitingly, we have decided to run a third group on Saturdays. This group will run from 12:15-1:15pm and is aimed at parents. We will teach you the methods that your children are taught as this will help you to help your child. 
