NOTICES ...

We continue to do our termly **attendance monitoring** of every pupil. The average attendance remains at 97% however, if attendance falls below 95% it is monitored more closely by the school. Very rarely, it might fall below 90%- there needs to be good reason for this level of absence otherwise school will need to set up an agreement with parents to raise attendance to better levels.

Please also note that if you have an appointment planned for your child, such as a medical appointment, the most effective way to tell us is via the office. The office organise registers everyday and act on all absence, they also relay the information back to the class teacher. Finally, if there is a situation such as medical treatment being prolonged, we must see evidence in writing from the provider. This is local authority guidance which ensures that schools can confidently account for the whereabouts of any child who is absent for a longer period.

Next week is the last **open-air revision sessions for children in year six**. Children don't need to bring anything extra. The sessions will run from 8:25am to 8:40am and are optional. Should your child wish to attend, no permission slip is required, they just need to turn up promptly! Grammar and maths will be covered each session. Sessions next week will be on Tuesday and Wednesday.
