Last Friday we had the **Spelling Bee** final and I announced the winners in last week's newsletter. Year 3 completed their final on Monday and the winner is Simanyu. Well done Simanyu!

Foundation Stage thank you for your support with their 'under the sea' dress-up day on Monday. It has really inspired the children and they are hungry for knowledge about the topic! There were some very excited children when we learnt about beach habitats this week: there may be many requests for a trip to the seaside over the summer holidays!

Year 4 parents got a glimpse into life at Hill End yesterday, as pupils performed an assembly, written by themselves, about their stay. Parents heard about the infamous mud walk, the problems with keeping clean, the fantastic (and endless supply of) food, and all the activities they took part in based around habitats or teamwork. They were also treated to two favourite campfire songs.

Year 2 children are visiting Cotswold Wildlife Park today for their topic 'Habitats Around the World'. The children are going to see lots of animals including giraffes, meerkats and penguins. They are also going to listen to a great talk by zoo keepers on how animals adapt to their environment.

As a parting gift to the school, **Year 6** will be improving the sensory garden over the next few weeks. The aim of the sensory garden is to create a peaceful, calming, tactile environment for our children to make use of when necessary. Year 6 will be giving the fence a fresh lick of paint, introducing different textures and colours, hiding 'LPPS rocks' which give positive messages to the finder, and planting flowers to attract wildlife. We are asking for a donation of compost and any plants, especially those that release a strong smell (such as honeysuckle, lavender and herbs) to help us with this. A reminder about the **new PE kit**... We will be moving towards having house colour T-shirts for PE kit in the future, these are available to order from Trutex and are printed with the school logo. They are £4.50 each. For the rest of this year and 2018-19 academic year the options for PE shirts will be either a plain white t-shirt or a school house colour t-shirt with logo purchased from Trutex. From 2019-20 academic year house colour t-shirts will be PE kit. Non-logo coloured shirts need to be replaced with the house colour T Shirts as and when they wear out for your child. On **Friday 6th July** we are holding **a whole school book swap**. Last year's book swap was a huge success with children exclaiming how pleased they were to receive a new book in place of book they no longer wanted. The purpose of the book swap is so children can choose a nearly new book in place of one they have already read, as well as exposing them to different types of books and encouraging them to read over the summer holiday. Please can children bring in a book they no longer want (possibly because they have already read it, it is no longer age appropriate or it is no longer interesting to them) and hand it to their class teacher, starting from next week. On Friday 6th July the children will then choose another book to bring home. It would be great if we had a range of books to offer including fiction, non-fiction, picture and chapter books. Ladygrove Park Primary School calls out for **votes to bag a share of Tesco's bag fund**. Ladygrove Park Primary School is bidding to bag a massive cash boost from the Tesco Bags of Help initiative. Tesco teamed up with Groundwork to launch its community funding scheme, which sees grants of £4,000, £2,000 and £1,000 raised from carrier bag sales in Tesco stores awarded to local community projects.

Voting is open in all Tesco stores from 1st July through to 31st August and customers will cast their vote using a token given to them at the check-out in store each time they shop. Tesco customers get the chance to vote for three different groups every time they shop. Every other month, when votes are collected, three groups in each of Tesco's regions will be awarded funding.
