Year 1 were amazing on their trip to the Natural History Museum in Oxford last Friday. Their behaviour, attitude and questions were tremendous and they made us all very proud. Each class took part in a workshop, handling fossilised bones, teeth and poo. The children learnt how fossils were made and how to size up a dinosaur from its footprint. They also had time to explore the museum floor and enjoyed the skeletons, fossils, interactive displays and stroking the bears. Thank you to our parent helpers who made the day possible.

We had our 'moving on' afternoon on Monday afternoon. The children had the opportunity to spend the afternoon in their new classrooms with their new teacher in September. Please note that the classteachers in Year 1 have switched classrooms NOT classes. Therefore:-

Children currently in Class 2 will be in Class 4 (Katy Manthorpe) and children currently in Class 3 will be in Class 5 (Jo Hicks).

On Tuesday, children in **Year 3 and Year 4** had the opportunity to visit the 'Pumpkin Storytelling Tent' that was set up in a field by St John's Primary School in Wallingford. Inside the giant, colourful tent, children were transported to different worlds whilst listening to various interactive tales about terrifying, friendly, helpful and greedy dragons. Children then got chance to adapt a story and share their idea with their class.

Class 11 visited Didcot Sewage Treatment Works on Wednesday to enhance their learning about resources in the local area. The children learnt about the 4 Ps that should be found in a healthy sewer and things that are found in an unhealthy sewer. Cooking fat is particularly bad for sewers. The children took part in an experiment comparing the decomposition of toilet paper, flushable and non-flushable toilet wipes: toilet paper was the only one that decomposed. Even flushable wipes should not really be flushed down the toilet! We then donned hard hats and high-viz jackets and went on a tour of the site. After the tour, the children became sewage treatment engineers and were challenged to clean up some 'sewage' (not real) by making a filtration system. The day was filled with learning opportunities - Jasmine was horrified to learn that we ingest plastic, the size of a credit-card, each year, due to micro plastic that ends up in sewers.

On Wednesday, **Year 5** spent the day visiting the Sutton Courtney nature reserve to learn about life cycles. In glorious sunshine, we had the chance to pond dip and identify the creatures we found; recreate the way bees pollenate plants and look at the different life cycles of a variety of mini beasts. We also loved having the opportunity to explore and play in the trees too. A big thank you to the parents who helped on the trip.

Yesterday, our **Year 2** finalists took part in the **BIG SCIENCE EVENT** held at the New Science Centre in Oxford. They did incredibly well to get to this point by being selected from over 100 teams. They shared their presentation with a group of panellists and other schools. They thoroughly enjoyed the range of activities that were on offer, including a sugar experiment by ABOTT. We are very proud of them and hope to get another group in the finals next year. Pictures will be on our blog.

Please note that the school is piloting a **summer club** in the first week of the summer holidays with Sam Abrey and Full Circle Sports. We are testing this initiative to give more options for parents during holiday time, give children more choice of activities during the holiday and for extra budget income to support the work of the school during term times. Thank you to the current School Council who have been working with me this term on a large project to analyse the wider curriculum at school. I have been explaining the National Curriculum guidance for each subject and they have been discussing what they enjoy learning as well as tabling new ideas for the future.
