This week, selected children from Year 4 and Year 6 competed in maths challenges:-

On Tuesday Aalyaya, Isaac, Sam and Eleanor went to Summer Fields School in Summertown. They worked in pairs to compete against other Year 4 children from all across Oxfordshire. The afternoon consisted of a number of different challenges including number problems and fun puzzles which they thoroughly enjoyed. We are really proud of the children for trying their best and representing the school.

On Thursday, Euan, Mikey, Sophie, Corey, Tamar and Filip entered the Year 6 maths challenge at Headington Preparatory School. They grappled with several rounds of intense questions. The brain growth across the room was almost tangible! Ladygrove was one of a few state schools working alongside many private schools. When the results were announced, we were so proud to hear that Euan and Mikey came a close second. Well done to all who attended!

Year 6 are spending the day with Mr Elkins (representing his First Aid company SaveYu). They were taught valuable skills in all areas of first aid and were hands on with dummies and other resources (see the school blog). To allow Year 6 more focused time and access, the children worked on the First Aid in small groups. While they weren't doing first aid they were making Diva lamps and Diva sweets to understand more about celebrating Diwali. They have also been challenged to solve and give good reasons to their solutions in problems related to dice.

A reminder of how to access pastoral support at (and beyond) the school:

Our Inclusion team is Carrie Barringer (Inclusion Manager), Carol Turner (Special Needs Co-ordinator), and Sarah Cheetham (Emotional Literacy Support Assistant). The team support learners and families across the school working with class based staff and other professionals in school. The Inclusion team offer information, support and guidance on issues such as SEN, child protection, bereavement and behaviour management. The team supports children and families when they join the school to make smooth and well planned transitions into their new class teams and to ensure that important information and strategies are shared with colleagues across the school.

Work with children The team are able to work with children directly in the classroom across the school supporting children to become "School and classroom ready". The team are able to meet with parents to help set up new routines, to observe children and to model behaviour strategies. Note that the Local Authority have just realised a leaflet about school readiness- this is for new starters to school but it still holds useful information for all. We have put this on the website.

CAMHS and Therapeutic support The Inclusion Team liaises with professionals from the Child and Adolescent Mental Health Service and coordinates interventions that support children's emotional and mental health needs; we can support parents to make referrals for external support.

Year 6: Please note that our Year 6 Money Matters Craft Fair is on **FRIDAY 13th DECEMBER** at 2.30pm. Parents are invited. Our curriculum letter has conflicting dates for this and apologies for any confusion this may have caused.

Reminder: Admissions to school (Academic Year 20/19): If your child was born between 1st September 2015 and 31st August 2016 you must apply for a school place for your child for entry in the academic year September 2020. You will be able to apply on-line from 1st November 2019. Please visit www.oxfordshire.gov.uk/admissions for further information. NB The deadline line date for online applications is 15th January 2020. Please remember the following:-

- It is the responsibility of parents/carers to apply for a school place by the deadline of 15 January 2020
- If your child is attending nursery classes within a primary school, you must still apply for a place in the main school
- You can list three different schools in order of preference. We strongly advise you to use all three preferences
- We advise you to enter your catchment (or designated) school as one of your preferences
- Attending your catchment school does not entitle you to free home to school transport if it is not your closest school and / under 2 miles away
- If your application is late, you are far less likely to get a place at one of your preferred schools.
