This morning, **foundation stage** performed 'we are going on a bear hunt' to parents. The children were very enthusiastic and have loved learning the story. We look forward to sharing our innovated version with you in a few weeks.

Foundation Stage have also been learning how to keep safe near roads (and in our garden). A booklet has been emailed to parents with ideas and facts that may be useful if you want to talk about safety at home too. The booklet is also on our website under 'letters' tab.

Update from Dr ShorrockSadly, I have come to the end of my second week and the end of this part of the Shanghai teacher exchange and it has been another amazing week. This week, I spent my days at Jing'an Educational College Affiliated School (JECAS) being looked after by Sherry - who will visit our school in March, on the second part of this exchange. Throughout the week, I have observed maths lessons from all year-groups, noticing the consistency of teaching, the quick pace and the 'ping-pong' style of teaching - which I aim to emulate upon my return. One highlight of the week was the opportunity to teach a lesson to the Chinese children. My English partner teacher and I both team-taught, 'solving equations' to a Year 6 class. It was a fantastic opportunity. Not only were we able to successfully deliver a lesson (the Chinese children had a high standard of English) with many Chinese teachers observing but the Chinese teachers also learnt a few strategies from us that they will use going forwards. The trip, as a whole, has been the best professional development that I have ever received - the opportunity to study how maths is taught in a different country has been inspiring and I hope to return to the UK to inspire the children at school. The Chinese people are very patriotic and believe that education is of upmost importance: they put the child's welfare first and it shows in everything that they do at school. I very much look forward to welcoming Sherry and Ariana to our school during March 2020 when we will be able to learn even more. Dr Claire Shorrock

Reminder: Admissions to school (Academic Year 20/19): If your child was born between 1st September 2015 and 31st August 2016 you must apply for a school place for your child for entry in the academic year September 2020. You will be able to apply on-line from 1st November 2019. Please visit www.oxfordshire.gov.uk/admissions for further information. NB The deadline line date for online applications is 15th January 2020. Please remember the following:-

- It is the responsibility of parents/carers to apply for a school place by the deadline of 15 January 2020
- If your child is attending nursery classes within a primary school, you must still apply for a place in the main school
- You can list three different schools in order of preference. We strongly advise you to use all three preferences
- We advise you to enter your catchment (or designated) school as one of your preferences
- Attending your catchment school does not entitle you to free home to school transport if it is not your closest school and / under 2 miles away
- If your application is late, you are far less likely to get a place at one of your preferred schools.



£1,320 to support your child's learning and development? If you are eligible, your child will automatically receive

Free School Meals when they reach Key Stage 2.



Additional funding for your child

Your child's school may be able to claim an additional £1,320 to spend on supporting your child's learning?

How could this help my child?

Schools will use the money in ways they think will support your child's learning and development and improve their educational outcomes.

Do I qualify?

If you receive one of the following benefits, your school will be entitled to claim extra funding for your child:

- Income Support
- Income Based Job Seekers Allowance
- Child Tax Credit Only (with income up to £16,190) with no element of Working Tax Credit
- National Asylum Seekers Support
- Guarantee Element of the State Pension Credit
- Employment and Support Allowance (income related)
- Universal Credit (income dependant)

Or if your child:

- Has been in local-authority care for 1 day or more in England or Wales
- Has been adopted from care in England or Wales
- Has left care under a special guardianship order or residence order in England or Wales

What do I do next?

If you think you qualify, it's quick and easy. Talk to your child's teacher or the school office and the school will apply for the funding.

What is a Growth Mindset?

Mindset refers to our beliefs about ourselves and where our intelligence, talents, personality and abilities come from. Research shows that people's mindset can exist along a continuum from a 'fixed' mindset to a 'growth' mindset.

Those with a fixed mindset believe that talent alone creates success; that ability, intelligence and talents are fixed and unchangeable. This leads to a fear of failure, the avoidance of challenge, an unwillingness to put in effort, and a tendency to give up when things get hard; behaviours that limit the chances of success and achievement in sporting endeavours, school work, and life in general.

However, those with a growth mindset believe that brain and natural talent are just the starting point of success; that our abilities, intelligence and talents can be developed through hard work, effort and perseverance. This mindset leads to learning behaviours that promote progress and achievement: a willingness to take on challenge and to keep trying when things get hard; a belief that mistakes are just a part of learning and an acceptance of feedback as a useful way to make changes to improve.

An important thing to know is that we can learn to have a growth mindset and there are actions that we can take to nurture a growth mindset in ourselves and in our children or students. Unfortunately there are also many ways we can unintentionally reinforce a fixed mindset. So, come along to our parent workshop to learn how to nurture a growth mindset in your child.
