This week, while completing their activities, the pupils have all been working really well together in their classes with the school focus on good collaboration.

If you are over on Key Stage 2 side you will have noticed that some of the old play equipment has disappeared a piece at a time. This is in preparation for our brand new (PTA funded) large climbing frame which will be installed next week. Fans of the A Frame should not worry, we are planning to reinstall it on the edge of the field. We acknowledge that the timing is not great but it is all we can get in the current circumstances. Parents of Class 10 (and to a lesser extent Class 11) need to be aware that the area will be cordoned off between Tuesday and Thursday next week. All the access points remain the same but for this period there will be less space where you usually stand at drop off and pick up. There remains plenty of space further back in the playground and the teachers will manage the transitions.

A change in the weather will always cause more people to drive to school. Although we have a lot more road space than many schools, we are aware that drop off and pick up are pressure points. We are also lucky to have permission to use the car park near the football club. The walk from this car park to school is the same distance as walking from the bottom of Avon Way or Tyne Avenue. No matter how difficult it is to drop off at school, please regard the safety of the children first. Do not park on pavements or across junctions. PCSOs occasionally visit at these times to ensure safety for all.

Next week is **Dyslexia Awareness Week** - this raises understanding and awareness amongst children about dyslexia; what it means, what it is and what can be done to support people who have dyslexia. On Friday staff will wear red and share a special assembly to support this cause. (<u>Children do not need to wear red</u>.) All our teachers and classrooms support a dyslexic friendly approach and if you would like to find out more about how you can support your child with their literacy needs please contact our SENCO Carol Turner via the office.



#### COMING UP.....

**Parents' Evenings**: We have been exploring all the possibilities around Parents' Evening in the last week of half term. There can be no visits to site and our phone lines will not support a large number of calls from numerous classes at the same time. Therefore we are planning to hold your Parent Teacher Interview by video conference. Class teachers will set these calls up securely (using the virtual waiting room system so only one family is admitted at a time). You will have the chance to reserve a 10 minute slot and then get an invitation. These meetings will mainly take place after school during the week beginning Monday 19<sup>th</sup> October. More information to follow, including what we will do if you do not have access to a device for video conferencing.

**Parent Governor Elections:** We have one parent governor vacancy and four nominations. We therefore will be running a Governor Election. Ballot papers have gone home with the eldest child in school today and please read the accompany letter explaining the voting process. Ballot boxes will be situated inside the school gates off Tyne Avenue and the gates entering the KS2 playground. The boxes will be supervised by members of staff from 8.30am-9.15am and 2.45pm-3.20pm next Monday –Wednesday. Thursday from 8.30am-9.30am. Reminder: Admissions to school (Academic Year 21/22): If your child was born between 1st September 2016 and 31st August 2017 you must apply for a school place for your child for entry in the academic year September 2021. NB <a href="https://www.oxfordshire.gov.uk/admissions">The deadline line date for online applications is 15<sup>th</sup> January 2021.

#### Please remember the following:-

- It is the responsibility of parents/carers to apply for a school place by the deadline of 15 January 2021
- If your child is attending nursery classes within a primary school, you must still apply for a place in the main school
- You can list three different schools in order of preference. We strongly advise you to use all three preferences
- We advise you to enter your catchment (or designated) school as one of your preferences
- Attending your catchment school does not entitle you to free home to school transport if it is not your closest school and / under 2 miles away
- If your application is late, you are far less likely to get a place at one of your preferred schools.
