Congratulations to all the children for their achievements in this unusual term. Well done especially to our new children and parents in Foundation Stage who have coped very well with the temporary arrangements. Thank you to everyone in the school community for your support and mindfulness at this time, it has helped us to address the reintegration of the children really well. This term we have focused on 'recovery' from last year, including emotional and relationship awareness while continuing to address any gaps and apply appropriate challenge for all, going in to next term.

Puddles! Even though we undertook a large scale resurfacing in FS/KS1 a few years ago the external drains on the public road still back up when we have significantly heavy rain. It only lasts during times of rain and drains quite quickly afterwards. We will continue to be on the gate to personally redirect you if necessary.

We are currently planning ahead and have recognised that outdoor sanitiser dispensers might freeze on cold days next term. It is not a problem if you cannot use these, there are ample sources for the children to use as soon as they enter the building. As ever we will communicate any adjustments to our Covid plans as soon as we make them, but we do not expect to make any adjustments that will affect you at this time. For your information, there are currently no new cases that we know of in the community and only a few children off school with cold-like symptoms.

My thanks to all our staff who have worked tirelessly this term to make things as normal and exciting as possible for the children while maintaining the best possible level of safety for health.

On Wednesday, Chris from Oxford University's Museum of Natural History, 'Zoomed' into **Year 6** to help consolidate their learning of 'Inheritance and Evolution' from their science lessons this term. He was full of interesting facts and the children were thrilled to hear more about Evolutionist, Charles Darwin and about The Great Debate between Creationists and Evolutionists. Molly (Class 14) said, 'It was fantastic! I learnt that birds are just dinosaurs in disguise.' Chloe (Class 15) said that she loved how Chris showed lots of fossils and models, including specimens of insects that had been collected by Darwin. It was a fantastic experience, which was interactive and full of facts. Many thanks to Chris and the Museum of Natural History for this invaluable experience!

This week, **Year 3** have enjoyed writing their own fairy tales! They have had some wonderful ideas, and everyone has worked very hard. We have also planted our bulbs ready for spring time, and practised our addition and subtraction skills in maths!



A BOOK PLEA! Please could I ask that children and parents/carers of children that have been taught by Mrs Parsons have a rummage through your books to check whether you have any of Mrs Parsons personal books. Each book has a Miss Parsons or Mrs Parsons sticker on the front, the back cover or within the first page of the book. Reminder: Admissions to school (Academic Year 21/22): If your child was born between 1st September 2016 and 31st August 2017 you must apply for a school place for your child for entry in the academic year September 2021. You will be able to apply on-line from 3rd November 2020. Please visit www.oxfordshire.gov.uk/admissions for further information. NB The deadline line date for online applications is 15th January 2021.

Please remember the following:-

- It is the responsibility of parents/carers to apply for a school place by the deadline of 15 January 2021
- If your child is attending nursery classes within a primary school, you must still apply for a place in the main school
- You can list three different schools in order of preference. We strongly advise you to use all three preferences
- We advise you to enter your catchment (or designated) school as one of your preferences
- Attending your catchment school does not entitle you to free home to school transport if it is not your closest school and / under 2
 miles away
- If your application is late, you are far less likely to get a place at one of your preferred schools.

How do you tell a child that they are autistic?


