Reminder: Admissions to school (Academic Year 21/22): If your child was born between 1st September 2016 and 31st August 2017 you must apply for a school place for your child for entry in the academic year September 2021. You will be able to apply on-line from 3rd November 2020. Please visit www.oxfordshire.gov.uk/admissions for further information. NB The deadline line date for online applications is 15* January 2021.

Please remember the following:-

your child/ren will not receive this immunisation.

- It is the responsibility of parents/carers to apply for a school place by the deadline of 15 January 2021
- If your child is attending nursery classes within a primary school, you must still apply for a place in the main school
- You can list three different schools in order of preference. We strongly advise you to use all three
 preferences
- We advise you to enter your catchment (or designated) school as one of your preferences

- Attending your catchment school does not entitle you to free home to school transport if it is not your closest school and / under
 2 miles away
- If your application is late, you are far less likely to get a place at one of your preferred schools.
