#### Covid update

Class 10 returned today in good spirits. Across the school, the numbers of those with apparent symptoms (themselves or in the household) continues to be slightly higher than the end of last term - all are at home until tests come back clear. Results from tests are still taking between 12 hours and 5 days to be returned. Drive-in continues to be the quickest way to get results back. We continue to rearrange staffing almost daily to accommodate those who have to isolate as a precaution (because someone in the household has symptoms). Staggered timings continue to control bottlenecking effectively but please ensure not to turn up too early for drop off as this creates crowding.

Another gentle reminder..... we are seeing an increase in parents coming to reception to drop off items such as; water bottles, wellies, spare clothes, revision guides, reading books etc. Please do not worry about dropping off items if you realise it has been forgotten as we can provide items in school if necessary. Children will be offered water (using a personal cup) if they have forgotten their water bottle. If you do need to come to reception, for example if you are late dropping off, we would like to remind parents to remember to wear a face mask. Our office staff (along with children and staff in their classrooms) are in protected bubbles and your assistance in this matter is much appreciated

## COMING UP.....

Flu Vaccinations: 94.9% have registered for their child to have a flu vaccine on 3rd December. If you haven't yet registered, you must do this by **5pm Monday 30<sup>th</sup> November** to ensure your child receives their vaccination. <u>The link closes on this date and late consents will not be accepted</u>. Further details about this is on our website under the *'letters'* tab. ACTION IS **REQUIRED** as this letter contains the link to the consent form and further information about the flu vaccine. Please ensure you do this as a matter of urgency. Failure to do so will mean your child/ren will not receive this immunisation in school.





**Christmas Lunch**: We are pleased to let you know our wonderful kitchen staff are planning to offer children a 'Christmas in a Bun' lunch option on Thursday 17<sup>th</sup> December. This will be a lovely alternative to what we normally do. **Reminder: Admissions to school (Academic Year 21/22):** If your child was born between 1st September 2016 and 31st August 2017 you must apply for a school place for your child for entry in the academic year September 2021. You will be able to apply on-line from 3<sup>ed</sup> November 2020. Please visit <u>www.oxfordshire.gov.uk/admissions</u> for further information. NB <u>The deadline line date</u> for online applications is 15<sup>th</sup> January 2021.

Please remember the following:-

- It is the responsibility of parents/carers to apply for a school place by the deadline of 15 January 2021
- If your child is attending nursery classes within a primary school, you must still apply for a place in the main school
- You can list three different schools in order of preference. We strongly advise you to use all three preferences
- We advise you to enter your catchment (or designated) school as one of your preferences
- Attending your catchment school does not entitle you to free home to school transport if it is not your closest school and / under 2 miles away

• If your application is late, you are far less likely to get a place at one of your preferred schools.
