Covid update

As we continue to unlock the school, here is a summary of what is happening:

- Parents do not have to use masks onsite unless they feel more comfortable doing so
- Play equipment is open to all at playtimes

In school from Monday:

- the wearing of masks for staff will be optional
- Year groups will be able to mix so group work can be done across the two classes (such as phonics groups in FS and KS1)
- Year groups will mix at playtime, easing pressure on zone timetabling through the day
- Extra curricular clubs will be organised in year groups, teachers will offer clubs and organise them to start the first week after half term
- Staggered timings will continue this term, to anticipate and alleviate any spike in the spread during the winter. Remember that this does not affect the amount of time pupils are being taught.

Online support for autistic women and girls

The Right Click for Women and Girls programme was developed to provide support, information and inspiration for autistic women and girls, their parents and carers, and the professionals who may be involved in their diagnosis or ongoing support.

It is an online programme that is free to access and has been supported by the Scottish Government via the Scottish Strategy for Autism funding.

Programme aims The Right Click programme has been built around themes and issues identified through a number of routes, the rationale for which and methods involved are outlined below. Our first goal centred on information: gathering information · adding to the knowledge-base · highlighting areas of importance where perhaps more research can be done. The other goal, 'Inspiration', was in response to increasing concerns about issues of stigma and negative language around autism and how these things impact on self-esteem, life-choices and individual outcomes (Snow, 2013) (Humphrey & Lewis, 2008). What was core, was that the project should be grounded in experiences of autistic women and that the resource would be: · supportive · positive and life-enhancing.

Free School Meals (FSM): If you are in receipt of benefit support from the government you may be entitled to Free School Meals. It is important you make the school aware of this as we receive funding from the Government for families that

qualify for FSM. If you think this relates to you, please come and speak to one of us in the office (with your National Insurance Number) and we can check your eligibility. Please note this is different to Universal Free School Meals where ALL children in FS and KS1 are entitled to a free meal daily.

Reminder: Admissions to school (Academic Year 22/23): If your child was born between 1st September 2017 and 31st August 2018 you must apply for a school place for your child for entry in the academic year September 2022. You will be able to apply on-line from 2nd November 2021. Please visit <u>www.oxfordshire.gov.uk/admissions</u> for further information. NB <u>The deadline line date for online applications is 15th January 2022.</u>

Please remember the following:-

- It is the responsibility of parents/carers to apply for a school place by the deadline of 15th January 2022
- If your child is attending nursery classes within a primary school, you must still apply for a place in the main school
- You can list three different schools in order of preference. We strongly advise you to use all three preferences
- We advise you to enter your catchment (or designated) school as one of your preferences
- Attending your catchment school does not entitle you to free home to school transport if it is not your closest school and / under 2 miles away
- If your application is late, you are far less likely to get a place at one of your preferred schools.
