# LPPS Newsletter

On Monday, Year 6 had a bespoke coding session run by RAL. The children learnt about coding (one of the many languages that we use in computing) and how it is used in most of our lives. The children were exposed to 'microbit' for the first time in school. Microbit is like a small computer that follows instructions and has similarities to 'Scratch'. Initially, children asked their Microbit to show their name but then after that, the complexity increased. The children learnt how to create a game that timed their reactions to seeing a shape that they had asked the computer to reveal. Children had to write code to ask the Microbit to count down from 3 to start the game and then to make variables to delay the start of the games as well as show the reaction time. A fantastic session in which all children achieved the derived outcomes. We look forward to using Micro Bit during our computing lessons this year. Year 6 Team

**Year 4** enjoyed a fantastic Tudor day today. Activities included making and tasting pottage, creating their own family shields and finally some Tudor dancing.



On Tuesday, year 6 were inspired to become scientists when they participated in a webinar led by RAL all about 'Spectacular scientists and where to find them'. They heard from three scientists, from various backgrounds, talking about their experiences of being a scientist, their journey from school to get to where they are now and the challenges that they have had to overcome along the way. Each presenter shared information about a scientist who had inspired them to become scientists. Year 6 learnt about various other scientists such as Henrietta Lacks, who had cancer, and after her death, how her cells are still used now for research purposes. RAL introduced a competition, open to the Year 6 children, with prizes (solar powered robot or crystal-making kit). To enter, children need to design either a 'loominary' - a model of their inspirational scientist using a toilet roll or a poster explaining why this scientist inspires them. Entries to a Year 6 teacher by 12 November.

#### Some Health and Safety reminders

A game from a television show has caught the imagination in local schools recently. It is a variation of 'What's the time, Mr Wolf?'. The concern is that the television show is rated 15 and is arguably at the high end of that rating. Please check that your child is not accessing this or any shows which are beyond their age group.

A reminder about older children **walking home on their own**. To be clear, there have been no issues, this is just a timely reminder. Usually in Year 5 or 6 some parents begin to allow their child to walk home by themselves if they wish. This is up to the parent entirely and is often based on proximity of home to school. If there is a problem on the way home or when they get home (ie. parent is not at home) the child should come immediately back to school and ring the front door bell for help.

**Pupils with mobile phones**- a reminder which is not in response to any issue. The school recognises that pupils might have a need for a mobile phone (for example- if they walk to and from school by themselves). For this reason, we allow pupils to bring phones into school, only in Year 5 and 6. If they do, they must surrender them to the class teacher who will lock them in the class cupboard. If they do not surrender their phone the school cannot be held responsible for its loss and the pupil maybe subject to sanction if the phone is used by them during the school day. Note that pupils can request permission to make calls from the office if urgent during the school day.

### Covid update:

Cases have thankfully remained very low at school this week, although there has been a rise in cases in some other Didcot schools and areas this week.

The local authority has released reminder guidance as we go in to next term. For your information, we would contact Public Health for advice if 5 or more positive cases arise amongst close contacts (ie. in the same class). Thinking ahead to the winter, if cases spiral, they are recommending familiar measures such as: reintroducing masks, isolation for close contacts, 'covid19 secure groups' (as yet undefined, but sounds like Bubbles) and maintaining staggered timings.

Nevertheless, we are maintaining all our current measures and there is no change when we return.

**Parenting Smart** The children's mental health charity, Place2Be, has launched a new website aimed at helping parents with typical situations they can find themselves in with their children. It gives practical tips to support children's wellbeing and manage behaviour. Advice can be found on over forty topics including:

- Understanding sibling rivalry
- My child is lying, what does it mean, what should I do?
- My child has trouble going to sleep
- My child says 'I hate you!'
- Cultural identity: who am I?

NB The deadline line date for online applications is 15<sup>th</sup> January 2022.

#### Please remember the following:-

- It is the responsibility of parents/carers to apply for a school place by the deadline of 15<sup>th</sup> January 2022
- If your child is attending nursery classes within a primary school, you must still apply for a place in the main school
- You can list three different schools in order of preference. We strongly advise you to use all three preferences
- We advise you to enter your catchment (or designated) school as one of your preferences
- Attending your catchment school does not entitle you to free home to school transport if it is not your closest school and / under 2 miles away
- If your application is late, you are far less likely to get a place at one of your preferred schools. Click on this link for easy access to OCC website
