Didcot Railway Centre- Year 3

Last week, Year 3 visited the Didcot Railway Centre to learn more about World War Two and the evacuations that occurred. We learnt how fire brigades put out fires, rode an old steam train and even climbed out of a WW2 air raid shelter! The day was packed full of information and experiences, which has in turn inspired the children to learn more about the war.

The excitement built towards testing their longships in a tub of water to see whether they floated, held together and whether they used the correct type and size of twig for their mast and sail.





