British Science Week

This week, all children have been celebrating 'British Science Week'. The week started with an assembly all about this year's theme of 'connections'. The children then made connections with each other as they all partook in a whole-school experiment to answer the enquiry question, 'Does the surface of the ground affect how far a ball will roll?' - this was a



In our Early Years setting, we aim to support the children by; Providing an enabling environment, so that they will develop and practise their skills, develop their own interests, creativity and independence; Building positive relationships with peers and adults, so that they will feel safe, develop their confidence and resilience to be able to collaborate with others; Providing rich experiences to encourage children's curiosity, so that children deepen their understanding of our culturally, socially, technologically and ecologically diverse world; Participating in quality interactions within a language rich environment, so that the children will grow their vocabulary and develop early language skills and communicate effectively; Sharing aspirational expectations, so that children are challenged to move their thinking and learning on to their next steps and are able to build on their prior knowledge and make links to new learning. Do you know our nursery class is open Mondays, Tuesdays and Wednesdays from 9.30am-2.30pm? In addition to this, we have a breakfast club from 9am at a charge of £2 per day and After School Club from 2.30pm-3pm also at a charge of £2 per day. If your child turns 4 years old in the next academic year (date of birth range 01.09.19-31.08.20) and you are interested in our nursery, please complete and return a registration form. Places for September will be offered in late June 2023. Please note that a place in our nursery does not guarantee a place in our school.


