The Schools' Safeguarding Team for Oxfordshire has contacted all schools to make us aware of a WhatsApp group which is gaining traction across the county. Apparently the aim is to make the biggest WhatsApp group in the UK. **This comes with very obvious risks** of exposure to inappropriate content and unknown people. WhatsApp's recommended age is 16+. Parents should be aware of this and should also engage the setting which prohibits automatically being added to a new group. Once this setting is turned on, a user can choose whether to join a new group instead of having it



automatically appear on their message streams. This allows users to make appropriate decisions about groups, just as they are expected to make the right choices when appropriately messaging. If you shouldn't do/say it in the real world, don't do it in the virtual one either.




